No my resolution is as follows: I resolve to do my best to not make the same mistakes in the new year, exactly the same way I made them last year!

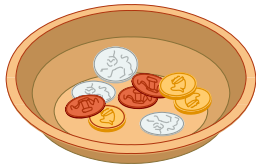

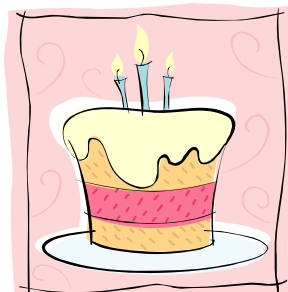

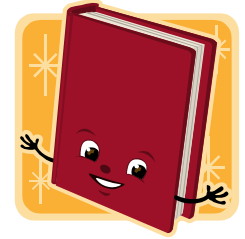

Thanks to Faith members for their generosity to CLM during the holidays and throughout the year!

A Big Thank You to Faith members for their generous support of the CLM Christmas Basket Project. It started with WELCA and the Youth Group taking six CLM families. An additional 20 CLM Angels were put on the Faith Angel Tree after it became known that several CLM Angels were still left. WELCA asked the members of Faith for help with another 12 angels. During the children's sermon, Faith members gave an additional \$440 to help support the angels! A total of 42 CLM Angels were provided with toys and clothes from Faith. In addition to the six food baskets WELCA provided,

four overflowing grocery carts of food from Faith was taken to CLM .

Once again I thank you for your outstanding response to this need in the community. Thanks, too, to Beth Landis for her outstanding efforts in coordinating, shopping, and delivering the items to CLM.

CLM had a total of 561 family units applied for help this Christmas.

Local churches, businesses, and organizations took 342 of these families.

CLM provided food baskets to the remaining 219 fami-

lies. CLM also provided this holiday basket to clients that came in for food assistance the week of December 18th.
