Summer Blessing Sisters and Brothers:

Well summer is upon us and all kinds of fun activities are planned for our Faith community. As you read through the newsletter you will find many opportunities for service and fun. The business of the church should not take a vacation just because lots of other places do. So, take the time to find out what is happening here at Faith and join

in with others.

This past week I was reading the May – June issue of Seeds for the Parish, a resource paper for leaders of ELCA congregations. There was an article that I found quite interesting and one I felt needed to be shared with the greater community. It is an article that speaks to the Adult Sunday Church School class materials they have been studying this past year. The article is entitled: The Unchurched.

"Knowing where a typical unbeliever is coming from is the first step to connecting with them. Researcher Thom Rainer interviewed thousands of unchurched Americans and published the results in : *The Unchurched Next Door*. Many of the following findings may surprise you:

- Most of the unchurched prefer to attend church on Sunday morning if they attend.
- Most are not antichurch or anti-religion.
- Most Americans have never been invited to church -- never.
- 82 percent of the unchurched are at least 'somewhat likely' to attend church if they are invited
- Two percent of church members invite an unchurched person to church.
- Most of the unchurched feel guilty about not attending church.
- Very few of the unchurched have had someone share with them how to become a Christian. And Christians have not been particularly influential in their lives.
- The attitudes of the unchurched are not correlated to where they live, their ethnic or racial background or their gender.

Many of the unchurched are far more concerned about the spiritual well-being of their children than of themselves."

I found this article very enlightening and wonder what, if anything, we as members of Faith might do in our communities to change some of these findings. Just something for us to think about over these summer months here in Southern Indiana along the Ohio river.

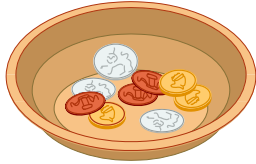

A final report on the Bliss, Blossoms and Butterflies Dinner and Auction this year shows there were 156 guests. Over 78 businesses in our community contributed to this event. After our expenses were paid, we show a profit of \$14,394 (this includes the \$1,000 from Thrivent Financial). Thanks to all Faith members that volunteered with addressing the invitations for the event, so that we were able to apply and receive a Care in Communities Thrivent grant from Thrivent. Thank you to all members of Faith that attended the event and/or donated items to the

auction.

We now have eleven women who have graduated from the Bliss House Program in 2007. Several of them are now living in the house next door, called Bliss Too. The Center has received a grant from the Ogle Foundation which will cover 2/3 the cost of buying this house if we can raise \$50,000 by September 2008.

Kids Café

Volunteers at the Center continue to cook meals and take them to the Boys and Girls' Club twice a week in Jeffersonville. In March and April a total of 707 meals were

served.

Food Pantry

The Spring Food Drive has been the main focus here since Easter. Faith has had a goal of 1000 pounds. A challenge to match or go over the total weight of our church council (1,900 lbs) was issued. At this time we have received about 600 pounds of food. I would suggest canned green vegetables and canned fruits for June and July. A big thank you to all Faith members for their continuing support of the CLM.

Lastly, just remember when you're driving around this summer to be careful and have lots of money with you. Just be sure to pay attention to everyone around you. Don't be distracted. Use your turn signals, hang up and drive. But most of all (here comes the trucker's wisdom), keep it between the ditches and the shiny side up. Have a blessed and safe summer. And do what Pastor's favorite passage says. It is Matthew 28:18-20. Be sure to put Psalms 142, v. 7, in front of that.
