From the Pastor

Another mark of a disciple is worship. A follower of Christ is one who worships...worships the Father who created, the Son who redeems and the Holy Spirit who guides us in our daily living. This act of worshipping God is what draws us together into a community of faith. Each of us brings his or her unique gifts and talents and personality into the community. There may be no other place where this set of individuals would come together, not at work, not in our volunteer organizations and not even among our friends. But we gather for the common purpose of worshipping this God who loves us and has revealed that love in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, our Savior.

In order to facilitate this act of adoration and worship, we have organized the time we spend together. We always gather on Sunday, the first day of the week, the day Christ rose from the grave. Every week we gather...but we gather at other times too. Christians have, throughout the centuries, gathered for prayer and worship hourly, daily, weekly, monthly, seasonal, annually. We have organized our time in seasons, (Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Easter and Pentecost.) and in hours (Morning and Evening Prayer, Prayer at the Close of the Day). From Advent through Easter, we hear and learn about the life of Jesus Christ. During the long Pentecost season, we hear and learn about what Jesus taught us as disciples and how we are to live in the world and share the good news.

Each season brings its own focus to our worship. What we hear, speak, sing and pray about changes throughout the year. In this way, we are exposed to the many voices with which God would speak to us. Advent and Lent are times when we are preparing ourselves to celebrate the great festivals of Christmas and Easter. This is why we do not sing about the birth of Christ or about his resurrection from the dead before the time of celebration. We need to hear God speaking to us while we wait and prepare for those wonderful and mysterious celebrations.

We organize our time together on Sundays also. We begin worship by gathering together to confess our sins and ask for God's forgiveness, to sing songs of praise so that we might focus our attention of God and end with a prayer that gathers our thoughts and sets the tone for the day's worship. Next we focus on Scripture, the word of God that shapes and forms our lives together. We hear from the ancient Hebrew texts, God's word of grace and law and we respond with a psalm. Then we hear from the early church in the second reading, their concerns and issues that help us focus on what God would have us do today. Finally we hear the life story of Jesus whom we follow and we learn from his life and words what he would have us do in our life of faith. Then we share the holy supper together, where we encounter the risen Christ in bread and wine, where we are reminded of how much God loves us by raising Jesus from the dead. Finally, nourished by God's word and the shared meal, we are sent out into the world to share this powerful message we have just experienced with the world.

Gathered together through the Holy Spirit to hear God's word and share in the holy meal, then sent into the world to share God's love, that is the pattern for our Sunday worship. In that holy time and space, we encounter the risen Christ, and in that encounter we learn and follow as his disciples.

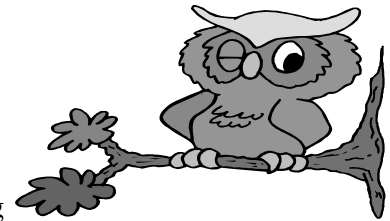
