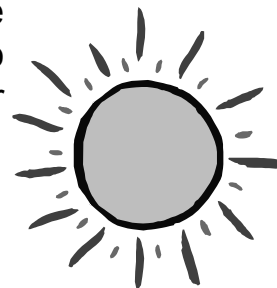
From the Pastor

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION**CAROL TAYLOR****Sunday Church School**

Sunday school will begin on Rally Day, September 11, at 9:15. There will be Sunday school time educational opportunities for all ages.

The Peters will be in the nursery for children under three years of age to enable parents to be free to attend the adult class of their choice.

At 9:15 there will be a Sunday school class for children three years through first grade. They will hear a Bible story and make a related craft. Cindy Holley will be the leader for this group of children.

Also at this will also be a class for children 2nd grade -5th grades. Pastor has volunteered to lead this group of children. With him in the lead do you want to take a bet on the fact that there will also be guitar music and singing?

As of this writing, Faith has no youth in 6th or 7th grade so there will be no confirmation age Sunday school class.

Tom and Kathy Hayes will meet with the youth in grades 8-12.

There are two educational opportunities for the adults; Kate Scott will lead a class dealing with current events and life time situations titled My Faith in My Life. How does what I say and believe carry over to how I act during the week? She has more information in her article elsewhere in the newsletter.

As stated in the last "Lutheran Magazine", the national church is making a big attempt to interest its members in Bible Study. New courses have been written and are available from Augsburg Fortress Press, and a new Blue Bible has been published. We will offer the first of these courses this fall titled "The Greatest Story" - a Bible introduction. This course is written for 16 sessions. There are a variety of courses to choose from when this one is completed. This course is an over view of the Bible beginning with Why the Bible was written, the Creation stories, God's People on the Move, Kings and Kingdoms. The material then moves through the history of the prophets to a chapter on Why the Old Testament is Important for Us. The last 6 chapters are a brief look at God's Answer to his people. - The Birth of Jesus, a study of His life, and the formation of the early church.

Each church received information on this course from the ELCA. When Pastor showed this information to me I found that was very interesting, informative, and well written. I feel it will be a very worth while reason for all of us to get up and get going on Sunday mornings this fall. . My statement was "Let's do it". I am excited about teaching this material and hope it attracts at least the ten people who said they wanted a Bible study on the Christian Education questionnaire sent out last spring. You are very welcome if you did or even if you did not check Bible study. Come check it out for yourself. ***This is your invitation to come and join us at 9:15 for the next 16 Sundays beginning on Sept. 11th.***

We will continue to have educational opportunities for the younger children during the worship service. As of this writing three of the four young women who have been teaching during the sermon, prayers of the church and anthem have agreed to return this fall. We welcome back Sandy Neatham, Megan Holman, and Kristina Peter. The fourth person has not yet responded as of this writing. We will again use "One Room Sunday School" as our curriculum. The 9:15 classes will be totally different from what is offered during the worship service and we strongly recommend that children attend BOTH the Sunday school time and the worship time sessions.

Thursday Bible Study - 1:00 pm

This Bible study is for adults interested in a verse by verse study and discussion of different Books of the Bible. The interest and attendance at this study remained at 11 or 12 people all summer long. At this time we are on Chapter 14 of Mark. We asked Pastor "What's next" His answer, "Luke". We hope to finish Mark during the rest of July and August and then begin with Luke in the fall. You do not have to wait until fall to join us. There is no set curriculum, we read, discuss our reactions, they are different from each other, to what we have read. Pastor fills in with his ton of Biblical history and knowledge. We always go home feeling it was an hour well spent. If you have time on Thursday at 1:00, come and give this discussion group a try. We are not doing lunch for each other during the summer, just bring yourself, no cooking required. I bet we can hook you and reel you into the class if you will come and give it a chance.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION CONT'D**CAROL TAYLOR****Confirmation Class and SCC Youth Information**

There will be no confirmation classes this fall because, as of this writing, there are no 6th or 7th grade youth in our congregation. We, like many other congregations, are feeling the effects of the aging Lutheran population in our churches. Pastor and I will both really miss the classes and discussions with the youth. **If there are any youth, grandchildren, step children, neighbor children, who would be interested in the confirmation program please call the office and let us know. 282-6993.** Pastor and Carol really do want to teach on Wed evening. Help us find some students.

This also means that the confirmed youth will have to do both the acolyte and the crucifer jobs each week. With only 16 available youth they will have to be on the schedule every other month. Registration for the National LYO trip to New Orleans will be Oct 9 @ 2:00pm. If you plan to attend this event we MUST have your registration form and non-refundable registration fee by Sunday Oct 2nd so that you can be registered with the other South Central Conference names to enable all SCC youth to be placed in the same hotel. So far Kristina and Cheyanne Peter, Eric and Tera Miller, and Miranda Mumaw plan to attend with Lisa Peter as their chaperone.

At the June conference meeting the South Central Conference voted to establish a paid leadership position (\$100.00) per month, for approximately 10 hours work per month, for someone to co-ordinate the SCC youth events and Peer ministry program. This person will also be responsible for getting us registered for the LYO New Orleans national event and leading this trip. If you are interested, there is a job description for this position on the church bulletin board outside Patti's office. If you are interested or have questions, see Carol Taylor or Pastor Scott. You will be hearing from us as we raise money for this trip of a lifetime for these youth. (around \$900.00 per person to go).

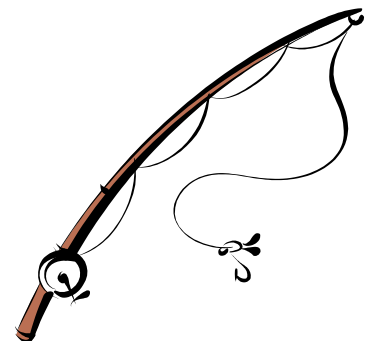
Speaking of home, I would like to thank everyone that was involved with the fund raiser on the 17th. It sounds as though it was a great success and should supply gas for a few years to come!

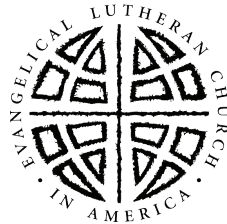
Again, it is good to be home and I look forward to seeing all of you at church. Have a wonderful month and God's peace to all.
