### From the Pastor

This month we are beginning something new in our worship life. Beginning on Wednesday, October 5, we will offer a worship service with communion beginning at 7:00PM. Preceding the worship service at 6:30PM a light supper will be shared. This is a regular Lutheran liturgy written by Mary Haugen and Susan Briehl called *Unfailing Light*. It was written specifically to use during an evening communion worship service. It includes the elements that are familiar to us in our Sunday morning worship service.

Susan Briehl is an ELCA pastor who has served as executive director of Holden Village, a Lutheran center for renewal in the North Cascade Mountains in Washington State. She began that ministry in August 1994 along with her husband, Martin Wells. Previously, they served as campus pastors at Pacific Lutheran University and as pastors of Our Savior's Lutheran Church in Bellingham, Wash. Currently, she works with the Valparaiso Project on the Education and Formation of People of Faith in Indiana and as the Distinguished Professor of the Art of Ministry at Wartburg Seminary, Dubuque, Iowa.

Haugen has written several liturgies for the ELCA. These include *Now the Feast and Celebration*, (written in collaboration with then campus pastors at Pacific Lutheran University Susan Briehl, Dan Erlander and Martin Wells), *Unfailing Light*, an evening communion service written in collaboration with Pastor Susan Briehl, "Setting Two" for the *Evangelical Lutheran Worship Book* (ELW), and an evening prayer service, *Holden Evening Prayer*, originally written for Holden Village. These liturgies have been published in various forms, with some of them appearing in the ELCA hymnal supplement *With One Voice Evangelical Lutheran Worship* (2006).

We are offering this time as an opportunity to serve those who cannot worship on Sunday mornings for any variety of reasons. The texts for the services will be the previous Sunday's texts. For example, the Scriptures, prayers and propers said during our worship on October 5 will be the same as those said on Sunday morning, October 2. The musical sections of the worship service will not be the same but are very easy to learn. We will also sing hymns that come from a variety of resources but are hymn-like in style.

If you cannot join us in worship on Sunday mornings, please consider joining us for this worship service on Wednesday nights.

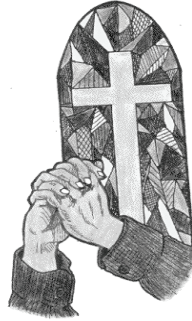

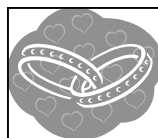

Christian Education Articles October 2011**Weekday Church School**

Faith Weekday Church School resumed classes for 2011-2012 on September 8<sup>th</sup> with 13 children enrolled in Mrs. Davis and Mrs. Maas' older three year old class. This class left 4 older three's on their waiting list. There are 12 younger three's in Valerie Jansing's class. She has three children left on her waiting list. The four's have 28 in their class and left eight children waiting to get into the Pre-K class. We are very sorry that we could not serve all of the children who wanted to come. I hope that these children have found another school because the pre-school experience has been proven to be very important for children.

Our staff of 23 continues to volunteer their time and many talents to help these 53 students get a good start in their educational life. But there is so much more to the weekday program than just the academic education taught in each class. Our primary focus is on teaching about God who made them and Jesus who loves them and forgives them no matter what they do. We teach about a God of love who came to the earth he created to help his created people praise, thank, obey, and serve Him. They learn to praise Him in song and prayer before we eat, and at the end of the day. Our closing prayer is a summary of the day's events. The words of our closing song say it all. "Thank- you God for a happy day. Thank you God for our friends and play." We teach that God wants us to help (serve) one another, like the doctor, policeman or fireman help us, like the boy who shared his lunch in the Bible story shows how a child helped Jesus, like Jesus helped Joseph in the carpenter shop and his friends in the Bible stories we teach. They are taught that they need to trust and to listen to (obey) their teacher so that they can learn new skills, to obey the rules of the school so that everybody can be safe, and to choose to do the kind loving action as they play with their friends.

There is a saying: "It takes a village to raise a child". Here at Faith it takes over ¼ of our congregation to run a school that teaches about the God who loves, helps, preserves, provides, and protects, not just the children, but all of us. May God go with us as we begin year 28 as His hands in the world and in His service.

**Church School**

We have continued the "Church School" program that meets with children 3 years – 2<sup>nd</sup> grade each Sunday during the sermon, prayers of the church, offering and anthem. Our teachers teach once a month on a rotating basis using material "One Room Sunday School" that follows the lessons we hear in the Bible reading during the service. Sandy Neathamer, Megan Holman, Kristina Peter, and Beth Wright are sharing the teaching responsibilities for these children. They hear a story and do an activity. Each of the teachers will have a different activity this year. One Sunday the activity will be an art project, one Sunday is music, one Sunday is a practical application to the lesson done in a creative way as a roll play, or puppets, and one Sunday will be game time as they review their lessons. Thank you to these four teachers. It was great to see the smiles on the children's faces on Rally Day when they realized that their class was meeting again after the long summer.

**Sunday Church School**

Wow!! Would you believe it?! On September 11, Rally Day, **We had thirty-four (34) people in Sunday Church School!!!** **WOW!!!** The advertising, post cards, and word of mouth discussion really did payoff. That is almost 33% of those in worship. If you come to Sunday school you can help us raise this percentage.

Cindy Holly had 6 children ages 3yrs. to 1<sup>st</sup> grade in her class. She and pastor are using new **Spark** material from Augsburg Press and the new Spark children's Bibles. They will be on a two year curriculum that follows the Bible, so there will not be a problem with the children who go to 9:15 Sunday school hearing the same lesson for the second time in a single Sunday.

## CHRISTIAN EDUCATION CONT'D

Pastor Scott had seven 2nd -5<sup>th</sup> graders in his class. Did you know one of those 5<sup>th</sup> grade children, who had not come with the rest of his cousins, called his great grandmother and asked her to bring him to Sunday school? He had been a part of the pre-school program and several VBS summer programs and knew his cousins were getting something he did not want to miss. Nana brought him to class. God does work in His own way doesn't He?

The youth of the congregation had 5 students plus Tom and Kathy Hayes in their class. We have a total of 13 youth on our rolls for this year. When you have two or three graduate and move on and no one comes into the bottom of the youth group the group gets much smaller in a hurry. This has been the case for the past several years and has resulted in us having no one for a confirmation class this year. That is correct, there are no 6<sup>th</sup> or 7<sup>th</sup> grade youth members in this congregation at this present time. We really need every one of you to participate in the events, all of the events, the ones for fun, the ones for service to others, and the learning opportunities to keep this youth group viable and enjoyable. If you haven't tried the Sunday school youth class, please give it a try or two. How can you make a decision about something you have not even tried. Please get up on Sunday morning and give it a try. Then make your decision.

Kate Scott is the facilitator in the adult class, "My Daily Walk with Faith". They had 5 adults in that group. They are using a devotional book "The Funny Shape of Faith" as their guide. Our Daily walk with faith opened up with a group exercise involving paper clips and evolved into our topic of the day "from exile to 'inxil'". We talked about our summer time off, the pros and cons of being separated from familiar relationships and the different kinds of separations we face every day.

Future topics of discussion will be:

*The bridges we cross (and don't cross)*

*Rating God's creation: Is that even possible?*

*Dang-it verses Damn-it (and something about Pirates!)*

*"Though shall not" but sometimes we do anyway*

*Where are the breaks on this thing?*

And wherever else the spirit leads us!

There were 10 adults in "The Greatest Story ". This is the class that is an overview of the Bible. We learned that it took 1,000 years for the Bible to get into the form we now call "The Bible", the Word of God. We learned that the Bible is God's Story about His actions and relationships with His people. We read that the Bible contains many types of literature, songs of praise, poems of lament, history, prophecy, and that it is full of demand and judgment, forgiveness and hope. The whole last third of the Bible, the New Testament, is the continuing story of God's loving relationship with humanity through Jesus and the Holy Spirit. The second week we discussed how people, God creation, fit into God's overall on-going story.

The Bible emerged as an authoritative book because it created faith and empowered a new way of life, a life energized by a love, found in those who heard and lived its message. We can and will willing add more chairs to any of these classes. Please be like the 5<sup>th</sup> grader and join us as we learn together and enjoy each others company.

**EDITORIAL****DAN DIEKHOFF****'THE REST OF THE WORLD HAS GOT IT WRONG---****ONLY GRANDPA HAS GOT IT RIGHT.**

Listen in on this conversation and you will begin to understand my posture in these matters.

It was breakfast time when I called my granddaughters to come down for the morning meal. "What are you wearing? I asked. "It's a night gown!" was the immediate reply. "This is totally unacceptable for several reasons," I replied with insightful wisdom. "First of all, when I was your age, you didn't come down for breakfast until fully dressed." The world tells us it doesn't matter how you dress at home. My parents saw this proper dress to be a sign that you were ready for the rest of the day. A lazy fellow would extend the rest period as long as possible. "What you need is a morning gown if you need to dress twice at the beginning of every day," I encouraged. "I never heard of such a thing," my grand-daughter countered. Now you have just one more bit of evidence that the world has got it wrong, and only Grandpa has got it right.

I am amazed when I hear and see what the world believes about God and His church. It has been my experience the world largely believes ... "If I am a pretty good kid God will undoubtedly see I had the best of intentions."

The truth is, God is not impressed with good intentions. THE WORLD HAS GOT IT WRONG. What He does care about is results.

For example: If I were to volunteer to go to town and purchase something and failed to find the store, lost my list, or forgot my billfold no one would celebrate my return. It would all have been a huge waste of time and energy.

Jesus didn't come here with only good intentions. When God sent His Son into the world it was His word and it accomplished the purpose for which He sent that gift. Jesus went to town for us. He gets results for the kingdom. Just when we realize our humiliation and failures Jesus calls us to be His partner. "We can do this," He says. And this is what Grandpa has to say. And Grandpa is right, and the rest of the world is wrong.
